



Where and when can I take the computer-delivered test?

Currently we are offering computer delivered IELTS at our exam centre premises in Wimbledon – Tuition House, 27 St George's Road, London, SW19 4EU.

We will offer the test once a week and you can check the dates [here](#).

Will the Speaking test be on the same day as the other test sections?

Yes

Can I choose my speaking test time?

Yes, you will be able to choose the time and day of your Speaking test time at the point of registration.

How long will it take to get my results?

If you take computer-delivered IELTS you will receive your results 5–7 calendar days after you complete the last section of your test.

Can I take IELTS for UKVI (Academic) computer-delivered?

No, because we are not an UKVI authorised centre.

What are the practice materials available?

You can find familiarisation material available [here](#), which provides a clear overview of the computer-delivered test and how it works.

There is also practice material available at IELTS.org. As the questions and tasks on the computer-delivered test are the same as for the paper-based test, the material is suitable for all of you.

Do I register for computer-delivered IELTS the same way?

There is a slightly different registration journey. Regardless of the test format you choose, be assured that your test registration will continue to be carefully managed in line with the world-class processes that IELTS employs. You can book your test [here](#).

How can I access my Test Report Form?

Currently, you will continue to receive a paper Test Report Form.

Is it the same content as a paper test? Is IELTS on a computer harder than IELTS paper-based?

The computer-delivered test is the same as IELTS delivered on paper in terms of content, scoring, level of difficulty and test format. The Speaking test is not changing and will still be carried out with a trained IELTS Examiner.

It is down to your preference and choice.

Computer and paper based tests are the same price.

You receive a paper with log on details before each test section and this can be used to make notes on.

[Is there any difference between a computer-delivered or paper-based test on the Test Report form?](#)

The delivery method will not be mentioned on the Test Report Form.

[Am I able to take some of the test sections on computer and others on paper?](#)

No. Currently you need to take the Listening, Reading and Writing sections either all on computer or all on paper.

[Is computer-delivered IELTS available on demand?](#)

Computer-delivered IELTS is not available on demand at present. Registration procedures for computer-delivered IELTS are the same as for IELTS delivered on paper.

[What is the likelihood of seeing the same task items again when taking the computer-delivered test?](#)

Every IELTS test is unique. This means that you will never sit the same test twice.

[Is the computer-delivered test marked by a computer or by a person?](#)

The Reading and Listening sections are marked automatically by computer while IELTS Writing and Speaking continue to be graded by trained IELTS Examiners.

[Will computer-delivered IELTS be accredited and accepted everywhere?](#)

The computer-delivered test is the same as IELTS delivered on paper in terms of content, scoring, level of difficulty and test format, and therefore demonstrates the same validity and reliability.
