



Where and when can I take IELTS on computer test?

Currently we are offering IELTS on computer in our exam centre office in Wimbledon – Tuition House, 27 St George's Road, London, SW19 4EU.

The test is usually available twice a week and you can check the dates [here](#).

Will the Speaking section be on the same day as the other test sections?

Yes

Can I choose my Speaking section time?

Yes, you will be able to choose the time and day of your Speaking section time at the point of registration.

How long will it take to get my results?

IELTS on computer test results are available three to five calendar days after you complete the last section of your test.

Can I take IELTS for UKVI (Academic)?

No, because we are not a UKVI authorised centre.

What are the practice materials available?

You can find familiarisation material available [here](#), which provides a clear overview of the computer delivery method and how it works. There is also practice material available at IELTS.org. As the questions and tasks in the IELTS on computer are the same as in the IELTS on paper test, the material is suitable for all candidates.

Do I register for IELTS on computer the same way?

There is a slightly different registration journey. Regardless of the test delivery method you choose, be assured that your test registration will continue to be carefully managed in line with the world-class processes that IELTS employs. You can book your test [here](#).

How can I access my Test Report Form?

Currently, you will continue to receive a paper Test Report Form.

Is it the same content as IELTS on computer? Is IELTS on computer harder than IELTS on paper?

IELTS on computer test is the same as IELTS on paper in terms of content, scoring, level of difficulty and test format. The Speaking sections is not changing and will still be carried out with a trained IELTS Examiner.

Both tests have the same fee.

You receive a paper with log on details before each test section and this can be used to make notes on.

[Is there any difference between IELTS on computer and IELTS on paper on the Test Report form?](#)

The delivery method will not be mentioned on the Test Report Form.

[Am I able to take some of the test sections on computer and others on paper?](#)

No. Currently you need to take the Listening, Reading and Writing sections either all on computer or all on paper.

[Is IELTS computer available on demand?](#)

No, it is not available on demand at present. Registration procedures are the same for both IELTS on computer and IELTS on paper.

[What is the likelihood of seeing the same task items again when taking IELTS on computer?](#)

Every IELTS test is unique. This means that you will never sit the same test twice.

[Is IELTS on computer test marked by a computer or by a person?](#)

The Reading and Listening sections are marked automatically by a computer while Writing and Speaking sections continue to be graded by trained IELTS Examiners.

[Is IELTS on computer accredited and accepted everywhere?](#)

IELTS on computer is the same as IELTS on paper in terms of content, scoring, level of difficulty and test format, and therefore demonstrates the same validity and reliability.
